Malik Jeannet's practice sculpts physical spaces as well as mental imagery. Through objects, performances and installations, he aims to build environments involving both their maker and their audience, who play a crucial part in the completion of the works. In 2024, Jeannet inaugurated his artist studio and living quarters, the result of a four year building process. Sourcing materials from his immediate surroundings, reusing existing components and acquiring skills from various teachers, he meticulously hand-built a space — a project catalyzing his in-depth research on intimate spaces as places of existence, refuge and dialogue.

Malik Jeannet (b. 1997) lives and works between La Chaux-de-Fonds, Switzerland, and Paris, France. After a sportive career start (2008–2017), and after graduating from CIFOM-ET Technical School of Le Locle, Switzerland (2016), Jeannet has been focusing on his artistic practice. He has assisted visual artist and film-maker Ali Cherri in Paris and architects 2M26 in Kyoto. His home canton of Neuchâtel has awarded him studio residencies in Paris, France and Genova, Italy.

He is the recipient of the 'Emmanuèle Bernheim' Prize 2023.
